



Learning Disabilities Support

The vision for a better future for people who have learning disabilities was set out in Valuing People (White Paper, 2001). It argued that people should have equal rights as citizens and that services for people with learning disabilities should promote inclusion, independence and choice.

These sentiments were confirmed in the Valuing People Now report published in January 2009, stating that more people should have opportunities to live in their local communities, have a home of their own, and use their skills and talents in a job wherever possible.

Carewatch believes that by providing services which have a focus on promoting independence and wellbeing it will assist people who have learning disabilities to have more choice and control and to make a positive contribution to their lives, to their families and local communities.
